Family to Family



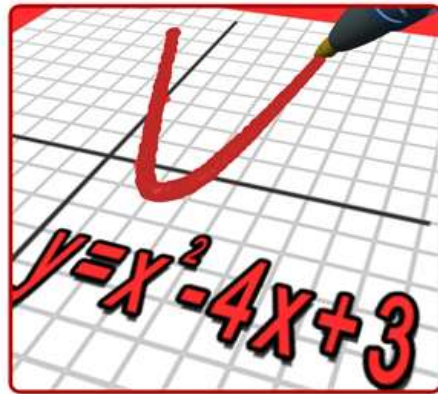

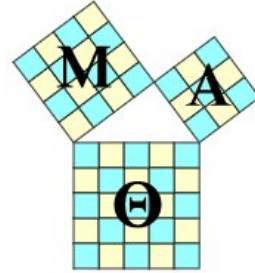

SAIL Devotional and Assignment Book

From the Desk of Mrs. Janet Fogh:

Good afternoon! It is my intention to give the VCS family an opportunity, no – a challenge, to dig into God's Word each day with an innovative approach, whereby we are all studying the same verses each day and can thus be able to discuss the verses corporately and learn and grow in our relationship with God through this effort.

It has been my privilege, for the last four years, to use the SAIL Devotion format for my own personal devotions. I was introduced to SAIL by Mr. and Mrs. Harrell who came up with the original concept and layout. It has been a blessing in my personal life to study, examine, and apply God's Word in my life through this Bible devotional format. My family has also used SAIL for their devotions and we've had some wonderful family discussions as a result.

Last year, the ninth grade Bible students were introduced to SAIL as a devotional and in my third period class, the students seemed to get a great deal out of us going through the process individually and then corporately and collaborating on the meanings and application. **SAIL** stands for **S**cripture, **A**ttainment, **I**ntention, and **L**egacy. A more complete explanation is below.

Since we now are using iPads, it was a great opportunity to expand the original concept of SAIL as a devotional, and incorporate an assignment book with it and put it in an electronic format so the students can download it onto their iPads through Moodle. Thankfully, my husband is a computer genius and was able to develop a format for this to work and he designed the computerized template as well as spearheading the effort required to monthly have SAIL available for our students.

As we are still near the beginning of the month of October, this is a great time for you to join us and begin.

1. Go to the VCS website at www.go-vcs.com .
2. Click on Student Links in the far left hand column.
3. Select the red oval that says "Moodle" in the middle of the screen.
4. Scroll down and in the middle of the screen, under VCHS you will see 2011/12. Click on the 2011/12.

5. In the far left, green column, scroll down till you find VCHS Information Center. Select the VCHS Information Center.
6. On the bottom, center of the screen where it says, "Some course may allow guest access, there is a button that says, "Login as Guest." Select that option.
7. On the far left, click "Courses," then "VCHS," and then scroll down and select "VCHS Information Center."
8. You will see a block that says, "Guest Access" and you'll see a place to type in the Password. The guest access password is Falcons. Falcons is case sensitive.
9. Under Topic Outline, in the center of the page, you will see directions on how to download your SAIL Devotional and Assignment book. If you have the Keynotes app, definitely download this program using Keynotes. That is the way this program was developed and it works best this way. If you do not have Keynotes, you can download the file via PowerPoint.
10. Choose the October 2011 SAIL and download it. Check back at the end of this month to download the November 2011 version, and please continue to join us!

Now you are ready to begin and join the VCS family in studying Scripture verses.

Scripture: The Scripture of the Day to read, think about, and pray about. The theme of the Scriptures for the month of September deal with Christian character, integrity, and honesty, because we are focusing on integrity in all things this year in the high school. For the month of October there is a different theme – one of reaching out, inclusivity, friendships, and a challenge to discipleship.

Attainment: What is the main message, the meat of the verse? What jumps out at you as the key concept from this verse? What do you "get out of it?"

Intention: How do you intend to apply this passage of God's Word to your life? This is the application section where we respond, in obedience, to the message from God's Word.

Legacy: How would I like my life to be characterized in respect to this passage? How would I like my friends, teachers, classmates to describe me (now and in the future) as far as how I apply and live this verse? What type of legacy will I leave?

You will also see a place to enter a prayer, read about events scheduled for that day, and read the second verse on each page which centers around what God says about Himself in the "I am" verses. There is also a place at the beginning of SAIL to write goals for the month and there is a calendar of events.

One of the things I love about this SAIL program is that as we each enter our appointments, assignments, and activities of the day, we consistently see God's Word also and continue to reflect on the Scripture throughout the day. God's Word is so powerful - what better thing could there possibly be to meditate on throughout our day

the framework for our plans, ideas, projects, and appointments.

I hope this is a huge encouragement to you and your family. Thank you Mr. and Mrs. Harrell, for the impact this has had on my life, my family's life, my students, and now the potential to touch us corporately as the VCS family. To God be the Glory!
