

Chris Smith

Director of Athletics – Head Football Coach

As the first and only head coach in the VCHS system, Coach Smith has compiled nine consecutive winning seasons. Coach Smith coordinates the offense and linebackers. He also has coached the running backs each of the previous seasons. Entering into the 10th season as head varsity football coach for the Falcons, Coach Smith has compiled an impressive 69-29 record in that short time one of the best in Northern California. During this span his teams have won a section title (2007), 3 league championships, appeared in three section finals, won three California State scoring titles, and has placed in the 10 in the state on five different occasions for small schools. Coach Smith is just 4 victories away from 100 career victories at the varsity level as a head coach.

Prior to VCHS Coach Smith was the head coach, and athletic director at Calvary Chapel High School in Southern California where he posted an overall record of 27-11 and turned a struggling program around. When Coach took over at CCHS the team had managed to post only one win in the previous three years. In his first year at the helm Coach Smith led the Bears to an impressive 7-4 record and the section semi-finals. The team posted school records for wins, yards per game, and total defense. In that same year his team set the local area scoring record at 64 points per school for small school football. Over the five years at CCHS his teams made the section playoffs four times, and semi-finals three times. Before heading to CCHS Coach Smith led Arrowhead Christians Junior and Middle School program to a winning season in its' first year of existence. The middle school completed a 6-2 record. One year prior to coaching at ACA Coach Smith coached Tight ends and linebackers at Bloomington high school. After a tough start the previous year, the team posted a 14-0 record and a section championship in 1994, while setting the national scoring record.
